
OUR 2024 ECONOMIC IMPACT

TRANSPARENCY & STEWARDSHIP

Since August 2020, Barber County United has managed over \$3.84 million in community-directed funding across Barber, Harper, and Kiowa Counties. In 2024 alone, BCU stewarded more than \$1.73 million, supporting rural programs, projects, and partnerships that improve daily life in our frontier region.

By maintaining a lean operating structure, BCU reinvested 94.3% of all dollars into local work - spanning childcare, mental health, physical activity, civic infrastructure, and more. Our approach ensures that every grant administered, and every fund managed is grounded in local voice, guided by rural need, and directed toward lasting impact.



COMMUNITY CARES: Mental Health & Prevention

BCU's Mental Health Initiative began as Barber County's first homegrown effort — shaped by community priorities and sustained through local investment. In 2025, we build on that foundation by advancing SPEAR (Substance Prevention Education and Resources) into its second year, expanding youth-focused strategies for substance misuse prevention.

New initiatives include suicide prevention programming through KDADS and countywide engagement through Phase One of the Kansas Health Foundation's Food Forward Mass Action Hunger initiative. We also look forward to deepening partnerships with Horizons Mental Health and NAMI Kansas to strengthen rural mental health networks.



COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT: Connections

Leadership continues to be BCU's throughline — not only a focus, but a method. We invest in cultivating local leaders of all ages, in all roles. Through Coffee Talks, senior center outreach, grade school wellness, high school internships, and small business revitalization, we meet people where they are to build networks of support.

In 2026, this approach will guide us as we grow Leadership BCU programming, scale civic connection, and help residents shape their own rural futures — from classrooms and community centers to Main Streets and local libraries.

ARTS & CULTURE: Place, Voice, Spirit

From painting downtown windows to building trails that honor local heritage, BCU uses art, outdoor spaces, and rural placemaking to reflect and celebrate community identity. Our work has helped spark pride, preserve memory, and activate public spaces across Barber County. In 2026, we'll expand features at Memorial Peace Park with new interpretive elements that blend storytelling, nature, and mental wellness. Our commitment to active, outdoor living continues through trail beautification, community mural projects, park enhancements, and crossgenerational arts initiatives — all designed to invite connection, movement, and meaning in everyday rural life.




COMMUNITY SOLUTIONS: Innovation & Support
